### Minutes of the Meeting

The Board of Directors of the Nashville Christian Institute met at the Institute, with the following members present: A. M. Burton, S. H. Hall, A. R. Holton, J. R. Holmes, C. D. Smith, Robert E. Campbell and A. C. Pullias.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved, subject to corrections. The Executive Committee reported to the board as a whole that a letter of resignation had been received from Brother A. C. Holt, dated November 22, 1943. It was reported that Brother Hall had been to the school, explained Brother Holt's resignation to students and teachers and made his retirement acceptable to all concerned.

Brother Keeble was called in from the field to assume active charge of the school for the time being.

The Executive Committee reported further that Brother A. M. Burton had donated to the Nashville Christian Institute 2500 shares of stock in the Life and Casualty Insurance Company, certificate number 3238. A stock dividend gave the school 2500 additional shares, certificate number 3519. On December 1, Brother Burton donated 50 additional shares, certificate number 24829.

Brother J. E. Acuff, treasurer for special funds, requested that he be authorized to change the name of the account with the American National Bank from J. E. Acuff, Treasurer, Nashville Christian Institute, to Nashville Christian Institute, J. E. Acuff, Treasurer. A proper resolution authorizing this change was passed. It reads as follows:

"Be it resolved, that the American National Bank, Nashville, Tennessee, be, and it is hereby, designated a depository of this Corporation and that funds so deposited may be withdrawn upon a check, draft, note or order of the Corporation.

"Be it further resolved that all checks, drafts notes or orders drawn against said account be signed in the following manner: Nashville Christian Institute, J. E. Acuff, Treasurer."

Brother Burton discussed writing a letter explaining why the farm had not been purchased and explaining the work of the school as now operating. Brother Holmes suggested that the board consider the wisdom of developing a vocational or trade school.

Brother Burton suggested the need of an educational head for the school to insure the maintenance of academic standards. In this

connection Brother Keeble reported that the Institute had been recognized as an accredited high school for the present school year.

Brother Burton reported that Brother Trice had brought the books up to date and had established an adequate bookkeeping system, for which Brother Trice had been paid the sum of \$300. It was moved, seconded and unanimously passed that Brother Trice be employed temporarily as bookkeeper at \$75.00 per month.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously passed that J. E. Acuff. special funds treasurer be empowered to issue checks to Robert E. Campbell, Treasurer, for the operating expenses of the Nashville Christian Institute when approved by Marshall Keeble, or someone acting in his stead.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the Institute's general account be transferred from the American National Bank to the Citizens Bank, checks hereafter to be signed by Robert E. Campbell as follows: Nashville Christian Institute, Robert E. Campbell, Treasurer. The secretary was instructed to write Brother Campbell and give him the authority to make this change.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that a list of the employees of the Nashville Christian Institute, with their salaries, be forwarded to the secretary and made a part of the minutes.

Brother I. C. Finley was unanimously elected to membership on the board. The secretary was instructed to notify Brother Finley of his election.

Brother Keeble gave a report of the school's activities, mentioning particularly a special short course for preachers which is now in progress.

The accompanying report of J. E. Acuff is hereby made a part of the official minutes of the Corporation.

Their being no further business the meeting adjourned.

To the Board of Directors of the Nashville Christian Institute:

#### Financial report.

Attached is statement of funds received and disbursed by me. In a few cases it was not possible to make out clearly the names which were written by contributors on lists turned over to me; therefore, some of the names are probably incorrect. In so far as possible all contributions have been acknowledged by postal card.

#### Audit

The treasurer's report should, I think, be audited at least once a year or oftener if the Board so desires. I shall be glad to display bank ledger sheets, cancelled checks and other records to any individual committee or firm the Board may designate to make an audit.

#### Depository

I opened an account at the American National Bank in the name of J. E. Acuff, Treasurer, Nashville Christian Institute. In this form the account is under my control. It should, I think, by proper resolution by the Board be changed to Nashville Christian Institute, J. E. Acuff, Treasurer, so as to place it under the control of the corporation. Attached is blank form in use by the American National Bank containing proper wording for resolution.

#### Life and Casualty stock

A certificate for 2500 shares of the capital stock of the Life and Casualty Insurance Company issued to Nashville Christian Institute on Normber 4, 1943, having been transferred from A. M. Furton, and a certificate for 2500 shares, a 100% stock dividend on the above shares, issued to Nashville Christian Institute on November 12, 1943, are in my personal safety deposit box #1276 at the Nashville Trust Company. A certificate for 750 shares and a certificate for 50 shares made to Nashville Christian Institute on December 1, 1943, transferred from A. M. Burton, was endorsed and delivered to George B. Graves, upon order of the Executive Committee.

#### Pledges

Brother Keeble has sent in many of the contributions represented on the attached report, and a number of pledges have been received from him and from other sources. The Board should, I think, make some arrangements to follow up and collect all pledges. I hardly have the time or stenographic help necessary to do this work. I shall be glad to make up a list of unpaid pledges at any time.

#### Expenses

I have incurred \$12.21 expense for postage and other incidentals up to the present time, which amount I am donating.


The school is making splendid progress. I em sure that in the years to come its influence for good among our colored people will be immeasurable.
