Minutes of the Meeting

The Board of Directors of the Nashville Christian Institute met in the office of Brother A. M. Burton on Saturday morning, April 5, 1958, with the following members present: A. M. Burton, I. C. Finley, Albert Gray, J. R. Holmes, C. D. Smith, and A. C. Pullias. Marshall Keeble was also present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Brother Burton called attention to the fact that capital funds have been recovered from mortgages held and should be reinvested. It was also suggested by Brother Burton that these funds be invested in bonds. It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that the Executive Committee be empowered to reinvest these funds as they are received at the discretion of said committee.

The secretary was instructed to check up on mortgages and report at the next meeting.

Brother Burton brough up the problem of several members of the faculty not being members of the church and the need to correct this. The problem of salaries was also discussed, and it was brought out that teachers should be paid the best possible salaries, but that they should be dedicated to the work of Christian education at the Institute.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that the Board go on record as school policy that members of the faculty be members of the church of Christ, and that present non-members be replaced by members as rapidly as possible.

There being no further business to come before the meeting it adjourned, subject to call.
